Introduction

The Sydney East Hockey Association (SEHA) was formed in 2015 under the Hockey NSW restructure of associations in NSW. SEHA is the third largest association in the state based on membership and one of six associations in the Greater Sydney area and covers an area 400 sq. Km, taking in 12 local government areas, from the City, Glebe and Concord in the city/inner west, out to Bankstown in the south-west, down towards the Sutherland Shire in the south and back into Daceyville and the Eastern Suburbs. The association boasts more almost 2000 players incorporating 15 affiliated hockey clubs, 12 schools and four synthetic turf fields and a few grass fields.

1. PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Play Watch and Love the Game with SEHA

On behalf of the Board of the Sydney East Hockey Association (SEHA), I am pleased to present the Annual Report 2020, including the audited financial statements that show a healthy operational surplus \$23,103.

What an extraordinary year with the COVID-19 global pandemic significantly impacting community sport. SEHA proved to be resilient and ensured compliance with all governance requirements including, NSW Government Ministerial Health



Orders and our governing body Hockey NSW. Tough decisions were made to delaying competition start, reduce the number of rounds played, cancelling our representative program and heightened health and safety standards for individuals, clubs and venues in our region.

Our SEHA community stepped up to face all these challenges, SEHA embraced technology such as zoom to facilitate association wide communication during a time of fear and uncertainty. We worked collaboratively with our clubs to focus on member retention and ultimately provide a safe environment for hockey allowing the return to the field of play. We ensured timely briefings direct to Club Presidents and members as developments and information became known (see Diagram 1.3).

We proudly served:

- Clubs 15 affiliate Clubs and 7 non-affiliated clubs.
- Members 1,785 registered playing members comprising (o18: 1219, u18: 566)
- Competition Teams 27 women's teams, 47 junior teams,
- Representatives Players 173 juniors, 25 opens, 18 men's masters 60 women's masters

Unfortunately, our Schoolgirls competition that involves 12 Girls Schools (70 teams) that register in the term 2 did not compete this year – the COVID delay to community sport beyond term 2, resulted in this not going ahead this year.

The Board's focus is set out in our SEHA Strategic Plan 2017 to 2020, which sets out our Vision, Mission, Objectives and Strategies and is included in this report at the end. This will need to be refreshed and re-aligned with Hockey Australia and Hockey NSW who recently updated their strategic plans.

2020 Highlights and challenges:

- The Board our capability strengthened this year with new appointments to the role of Secretary Lorelle Byers who has many years experience with Canterbury hockey; and the creation of the new role Member Protection Officer held by Sonya Le Huray. Together our dedicated Board worked collaboratively over many late evenings to ensure the protection of the best interest of our members and clubs, not afraid to make tough decisions as needed.
- Membership retention / affordability focus slight 10% drop in membership compared to last year's 4% growth in membership and churn rate increased to 42% (see Table 1.1 and 1.2).

- A positive financial performance positions SEHA well going forward to continue its operations, development and representative programs.
- Affordability Cognisant of the financial pressures on families SEHA fees will remain the same in 2021.
 - This year Hockey NSW offered an incentive to members that registered by 18 July to also receive a HNSW fee component discount for 2021 season.
 - SEHA is a registered Active Kids Provider families benefited from the HNSW –
 Active Kids Rebate (\$100 vouchers school age kids) program once again.
- Governance special acknowledgement to Mia Strecker –Reeves our COVID-19 Safety
 Coordinator and all our Safety Officers across the association who stepped up and delivered
 COVID-19 Safety Plan requirements for individuals, clubs and venues.
- Competitions sometimes it takes almost losing something to truly appreciate its value and
 role it plays in the community. Directors Tanya Arathoon and Graeme Barnard's leadership
 together with their committees in uncertain times was outstanding. We are very grateful to
 have been able to hold both our women's and junior competitions this year and showcase our
 Premier Division and all junior grand finals via livestream.
- Our Representative Program managed by Director Chris Thuell conducted trials and announced teams, but unfortunately many were disappointed with the cancellation of State Championships. An expression of interest process was also conducted to ensure that no one was missed that was eligible for consideration for state selection for 2021.
- Congratulations to all who achieved Representative honors as detailed in section 8.
- Congratulations to our nominee Marylin Brown awarded Hockey NSW Life membership!
- Development Programs led by Director Debbie Dodd include:
 - showcasing our dedicated team of umpires and sponsor with new look SEHA Rhino Mouthgaurd shirts; and umpire coaches and officials with distinctive branded SEHA bibs to ensure a professional look, are identifiable and for a safe environment for all.
 - o utilized our competitions to facilitate development for coaches, officials and umpires
 - Andy van Pelt, RCC continuing the Schools Program (15 schools), and Centre of Development program for u13/u15s 18% increase in player participation (107kids)
- Partners and Sponsors we value XPress Promotions our merchandise partner, and our sponsor John Halkitis at Rhino Mouthguards.

This is only possible with the support of our exceptional volunteer base; our Board Directors, Convenors, Committees, Umpires, Officials, Coaches, Managers, Safety Coordinators and so many parent volunteers.

I want to thank David Thompson and his team at Hockey NSW who showed leadership in sport this year and in the way they supported all Associations.

Finally, I feel so very fortunate to work with such a wonderful bunch of people who were so dedicated, thank you to Secretary Lorelle Byers and my fellow Directors Tanya Arathoon, Graeme Barnard, Mia Strecker-Reeves, Chris Thuell, Lisa Jarvis and Debbie Dodd for their teamwork, absolute commitment and resilience to deliver their portfolio in an extraordinary year!







2. GOVERNANCE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

2020 has been a unique year for us all. The SEHA Board navigated the unprecedented challenges presented by Covid-19 not only for our association but the knock-on effects that impacted various aspects of our competitions, clubs, venues, members, officials and volunteers.

The priority focus for SEHA was to facilitate a safe environment for all our members and officials to get out of our homes and back onto the hockey fields for a modified shorter season.

Despite all the additional Covid-19 guidelines and restrictions SEHA were able to successfully hold, albeit abridged seasons for both our Junior's and Women's Competitions. Unfortunately, our representative teams were more adversely affected by Covid this year.

Feedback received at the end of the season was that the vast majority of clubs and players were absolutely grateful that they were able to get out on the hockey field and play the sport we all love, in a safe environment.

I would like to take this time to thank everyone involved throughout the year. To the rest of the SEHA Board, Hockey NSW, our clubs, venues, team managers, coaches, players, officials, umpires, ground marshals and parents and friends. 2020 is certainly a year we will not forget.

SEHA Operations

SEHA's operations adhered to the advice published by the NSW Government, NSW Department of Health along with the guidance of Hockey NSW. Earlier in the year, I was appointed as the Covid Safety Officer Role for SEHA and worked closely with Hockey NSW and the Covid Safety Coordinators in all our affiliated clubs and venues. This role focused on ensuring that all relevant Covid requirements were met across SEHA, and disseminating appropriate information out to our clubs and members.

During the early stages of Covid, the SEHA Board (like everyone else in Australia) quickly embraced meetings utilising technology to conduct remote meetings in a safe and timely manner. SEHA also used zoom meetings as a way to for our competition committees to meet, as well as communicate with our clubs, officials and members, join HNSW briefings and conduct training.

It was clear to the Board that utilising technology for our various meetings has been very well received, and this was something that we wish to continue in future years. As such, we have drafted a motion to facilitate its incorporation into our SEHA constitution for adoption at the upcoming AGM.







Pre-season

The engagement in the pre-season utilising zoom was well received, it was a great way to communicate with our clubs and members, in a safe and timely manner.

In preparation to get back onto the fields, as an association we needed to complete and submit a number of Safety Plans A & B to Hockey NSW.

Clubs were also asked to nominate safety coordinators to complete their own respective Safety Plans (A & B), Venue Covid Plans and Club Checklists. Hockey NSW reviewed all the Safety Plans (A&B) as well as each of the Club Checklists prior to any club taking the field for our competitions.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the safety coordinator's for all the work that went into the submissions and the ability to pivot and update these as the Covid-19 guidelines were amended.

Competitions

Our Competition Committees made appropriate changes to their respective rules and by-laws to reflect the abridged season, providing guidelines on how to safely operate their competitions while incorporating NSW government health and Hockey NSW guidelines, mitigate concerns and provide structure to all their coaches, managers, players and officials.

I am certainly pleased to confirm that we had no Covid-19 incidents nor delays to our SEHA competitions.

Hockey Fields

Our venues all submitted Venue Safety Plans to Hockey NSW ahead of competitions commencing. SEHA also worked with our venues to provide summaries to our members on how they were Covid-safe and what was required to enter their venues and utilise their facilities. These venue summaries covered their operational processes to mitigate unnecessary cross-over of players between timeslots, these included entrance and exit flows, location of sanitation stations, cleaning, signage, attendance declarations and visitor logs. These venue summaries continued to be refined as the NSW government amended their Covid guidance, and shared with our members and published on our website.

Member Protection

SEHA commenced a review on the Member Protection and Complaint handling processes and agreed to utilise the Hockey NSW policy as this was already fit for purpose and appropriate for our requirements.

I am pleased to announce that Sonya Le Huray, stepped into our newly created Member Protection Officer role this year. Her knowledge and expertise was utilised to considere 1 incident arising from the Junior Competition. The SEHA Board appreciated the advice provided by Sonya as it related to the Member Protection of our junior players and umpires, and the Board supported the recommendations and swiftly implemented the recommendations prior to the end of the season, with the aim to embed further in the 2021 season.

The SEHA Board commissioned the design and purchase of "SEHA Marshall" vests to be worn at each of our venues by a nominated person(s) who are conducting the ground marshal duties.

Whilst each of our Junior Clubs who hosted the games at their "home" venue already supplied volunteers at, it was agreed by the Board that the implementation of these new vests not only formalised the roles and duties performed by our volunteers, but visibly raised the profile of this important role.

The Board agreed that this was extremely beneficial to help provide additional protection to our Junior players and umpires, and this was especially important in a year dominated by additional covid safety protocols. As such the vests were rolled out mid-season to our Junior Clubs that host games as their venues. The ground marshal role will be further refined and defined ahead of the start of the 2021 season.

For consistency, these new vests were also rolled out to our ground marshals in the Women's Competition, again this was a great way to effectively distinguish our officials and volunteers and the important role they play at each of the venues.

Again, I wish to thank everyone for their patience and cooperation for a challenging season - looking forward to kicking off our 2021 season.

4. FINANCE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Given the year we have had, SEHA had an impressive 1.7k members participate.

Our total income was \$134,759.49 - down by 39% compared to last year- this was due to COVID restrictions which led to the cancellation of representative programs (junior, men, women and masters) and the schoolgirl's competitions, but we were very lucky to have a juniors and women's competition given the year that was. Please note this income includes overdue income received for the 2019 financial year relating to the schoolgirls competition (\$13,500).



Cost of sales continued to reflect the COVID effect as they came down 47% - The reduced competition rounds together with no representative training sessions resulted in significant reduction in field hire costs (47.53%)

This then resulted in an overall profit of \$23,103.31 (up 20.27% compared to last year). These figures are based on a cash basis Profit and Loss.

SEHA focused this year on development under the guidance of Debbie Dodd. Umpire coaching was provided and SEHA bought new coaching and umpire and Marshall Vests - total expenses spent in this area was \$3,895. Feedback has been nothing but positive so SEHA will look to continue to spend in this area.

Another \$3,021.50 was also spent to provide live streaming of the Grand Finals which worked out to be very successful and allowed members to view the games live and feel involved.

SEHA has ended the year in a comfortable financial position with \$69,067.02 as of 30th Sept 2020 in the bank and our term deposit of \$76,277.72.

Moving forward SEHA's fees for 2021 will remain the same \$20 per adult and \$12 per junior.

This year as a result of the COVID disruption to the season start Hockey NSW offered an incentive to members that registered by 18 July to also receive a HNSW fee component discount for 2021 season.

Active Kids Vouchers

From 1 July, families were able to access their second \$100 Active Kids voucher for 2020.

Following the impact of COVID on many of our hockey families, it is more important than ever to ensure hockey maximises the benefits of the Active Kids Voucher.

We have some tips below:

- 1. Collect fees via revolutioniseSPORT. If clubs collect their fees via revolutioniseSPORT, the \$100 Active Kids Rebate will be applied to the combined total of National, State (where applicable), Association and Club fees.
- 2. Any fees or subscriptions charged or collected during the season be incorporated into the upfront registration fee (e.g. a \$50 club registration becomes \$85 and includes turf fees normally charged during the season)
- 3. Create a value-add registration that bundles the registration fee with additional items (e.g. a \$50 club registration fee becomes a \$70 registration bundle that includes hat, shirt, stick and ball).

With some members eligible for the two-for-one Hockey NSW fee reward, it is important to check the combined total of all your payment classes. REMEMBER – if fees are less than \$100, parents will lose the difference.

6. JUNIOR COMPETITION REPORT

It has been a privilege to preside over the junior competition again this year, although extremely challenging, it is very satisfying to be reporting on a successful season. COVID restrictions derailed the season just 3 days prior to the scheduled commencement in March; and there was some public opinion that we 'would not even get onto the pitch' in this COVID year. We were delayed for 17 weeks, but we did it.

The committee

Once again, all participating clubs provided a representative on the junior competition committee. This committee made all the general decisions in relation to the running of the competition and rule changes, confirmed the draw, etc.; and worked well, in a collaborative manner. A special mention to David Richardson (Sutherland) and Kim Brookes (Moorebank), who consistently provided valuable input and common-sense solutions to problems as they arose.

The season

Pre-planning was in place, with a number of season options, ready to kick off as soon as COVID-19 restrictions allowed. The season finally commenced on Friday 17th July, and saw 47 teams, from 7 clubs* compete across 7 divisions, plus a non-competitive U9's draw. 10 weeks of competition allowed the season fit neatly into the 3rd school term, with Grand Finals to be played on the first weekend of the September school holidays.

Participating clubs: Bankstown, Glebe, Moorebank, Sharks, St George-Randwick, Sutherland, UNSW. * Sydney Uni HC fielded a joint team with Bankstown in the U11b division, as an 8th club.

Most divisions had two full rounds, seeing all teams play each other twice over the 10 weeks. The U17's and U11b's were the only exceptions, where there were too many teams to do this. For these two divisions, they played each other once over seven weeks, and then were split, where the top four teams and the bottom four teams played each other over the final three weeks. Both systems proved to be quite fair and saw the best two teams finish Minor Premiers and











runners up.

The U9's finished their season on Sat 12th Sept, with games at Jubilee Oval, Glebe, with all players receiving a participation medal. By all reports everyone had a great time. For all competitive divisions (U11-17), competition wrapped up with a Grand Final day on Sunday 27th Sept 2020, at Sutherland Hockey Centre. After the 10 rounds of competition, the Grand Finals were played between the Minor Premiers and Runners Up in each grade, without any other finals.

RevolutioniseSPORT

This was the first season, where the full draw and results were published using Revolutionise. Each club had a Revolutionise administrator, who was responsible for entering match results and other player data. Once a system was established, results were usually published by Saturday evening and seemed to be well received by teams, coaches and players alike. Player data was only available for SEHA clubs; it would be good to have access to non-SEHA clubs' player data. I believe Hockey NSW is still working with Revolutionise for a suitable solution.

Grand Finals

Due to COVID-19 restrictions, all Grand Final games were livestreamed and recorded. Due to technical difficulties obtaining the links in time, the first game of the day (U11b) was not streamed in its entirety, but the links were posted just after half-time. The links to the recorded games will be available until the end of the year, when we will need to host them elsewhere.

All games were umpired by junior (or near-junior) badged umpires, arranged and managed by Lindesay Brine (Glebe); the youngest being just 13 years old and the oldest being 23 years old. All umpires were sourced from SEHA clubs, or clubs participating in the competition. Each game also had a convenor on hand acting as a Technical Official. There were many positive comments on the standard of both the umpiring and the play, throughout the day.

Results

Five of the seven clubs had teams in the Grand Finals. On the day, three games saw the runners up defeat the Minor Premiers; and the U13a game going into extra time (for the second year running).

Finances

Once the draw was finalised, a draft budget was prepared, which projected a small deficit of around -\$550; however actual figures, once all invoices are received, are likely to reveal a surplus of around \$1,100 (around 3.8% on turnover). This is

due, in part, to some over budgeting and some minor operating changes, including not producing a hard-copy Grand Final booklet (usually around \$600). This decision was made to offset some of the cost of live-streaming the Grand Finals.

I would like to thank all the members of the junior committee, the participating clubs, players, coaches, managers and parents, who supported us and complied with all the requests and directions, to make the season a reality and a success. Thanks also to the SEHA Board, for their support and commitment throughout, particularly for the support to live stream the grand finals.





6. DEVELOPMENT DIRECTOR REPORT

This year has seen the focus on running and maintaining competitions, retaining players and working out the best way to support those competitions with educating and upskilling our developing officials. As there were no State Championships this year all our development has been on our locally run competitions.

Development is always a collective effort, with Women's Competition Director (Tanya Arathoon) and Women's Umpires Co-ordinator (Kara Seymour), Junior Competitions Director (Graeme Barnard) along with our Junior Umpires Co-ordinator (Lindesay Brine) providing strong leadership and enterprise to find and foster officials for development.

Congratulations once again to Marilyn Brown, one of our most experienced Umpires and Officials, who was awarded life membership of Hockey NSW this year. Marilyn continues to umpire and support our developing umpires, as she has done for the last 35+ years.

Significant achievements in development of officials were:

- Continuation of the Whistle Warrior Workshop in an online format
- Running of online Whistle Warrior Workshops for adult and junior beginner umpires
- Sourcing (by the Women's Competition) of new Technical Officials and buddying them with experienced officials to learn "on the job".
- Higher visibility of our Umpire Coaches, Ground Conveners and Umpires. This turned out to be even more important this year, as the vests and shirts clearly distinguished the role those people played in the day to day running of the competition.
- Our new umpiring shirts, sponsored by Rhino Mouthguards, were stylish and helped our umpires present as a team and Eight (8) umpire coaches were used in the Women's competition. Thank you to Luke Fleming, Alison Banks, Kath Calokerinos (Senior and Junior umpire development), Alex Withey, Jodie McIntosh, Ian Soares (Senior and Junior umpire development), Marilyn Brown and Debbie Dodd. Their skill and knowledge were invaluable in developing our local umpires.







7. SEHA REPRESENTATIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Field season cancellation

On March 24, 2020 Hockey NSW cancelled all remaining State Championships in 2020 due to the COVID-19 Pandemic.

This included all junior and open field state championships, women's masters, and the remaining men's masters' state championships that had not taken place. This decision also set the tone for all other carnivals that SEHA junior rep teams would normally enter, which did not go ahead.



Tamworth's U/11 carnival was moved to October to allow it to go ahead, but unfortunately the continuing risk of COVID-19 spreading to regional NSW and tightening health advice in August and September meant the event was cancelled for 2020.

Junior Rep Trials 2020

Despite the cancellations – the timing of the announcements meant that a considerable amount of preparation for the Field season took place.

This included issuing nominations – for the first time using the SEHA RevolutioniseSPORT system in full. We also got as far as SEHA conducting our full 2020 Junior Field Representative trials at Bankstown and Kyeemagh in mid-March. SEHA's received over 190 nominations (a new record) and our very talented junior players came out and gave their all. Additionally, SEHA again got great support from coaches and selectors to come out to the trials. SEHA thanks all players and supporters who made this effort.

Heartbreakingly, teams were named and posted on the website on the night before the announcement on March 24. I am sure all parents would agree this was very difficult for all the players who were looking forward to the 2020 Rep Season.

The teams named have been printed in this report to recognise our junior players for their efforts.

Thank you to everyone who contributed for their support.

SWHL Women's Masters

Coming under the Representative Director's overall responsibility is the women's master's program, which is managed in full by Carolyn Davies, SEHA's incredible women's masters convenor. Although the State Championships were cancelled in 2020, Carolyn still completed all the organisation required to set up SWHL teams in March 2020, only to have the competition postponed. The competition eventually went ahead for a shortened season and thanks to Carolyn, SEHA was able to participate with a full contingent of teams.

SEHA Division 4 were minor and major Champions this year!

Indoor season cancellation

On August 10, 2020 Hockey NSW cancelled all Indoor State Championships in 2020 due to the COVID-19 Pandemic.

Unfortunately, due to the relatively late announcement of this cancellation, SEHA also had to prepare for our indoor rep season, arranging the trials, all training sessions and issuing nominations via the SEHA Revolutionise system only the day before the announcement. We simply could not wait any longer to issue them (as it was only 2 weeks before the trials).

Thank you to the SEHA Indoor Rep Committee convenor, Tracey Najdzion for the work done to get this far.

Equipment storage project

SEHA Reps completed a long-planned project to find storage for all the equipment it needs to operate – including balls, training equipment and playing shirts. Until now this has been an additional burden for the volunteers of the rep committee (thank you to past members who have ensured the spare rooms and not so spare rooms full of SEHA equipment). This includes finding a suitable location and storing equipment in way that would ensure it was kept in good condition and secure.

Special thanks to Briars Hockey Club who have made this possible.

Hockey NSW State Selections

In 2020, due to the cancellation of State Championships, SEHA was requested by Hockey NSW to confidentially provide a list of players. These players were those that we believe should be considered for state squad selection as part of a new selection process to apply for 2021 state teams.

SEHA completed this task and congratulations SEHA players who have been selected who have been listed at the end of this report.

Looking ahead to 2021

The SEHA rep committee is in desperate need for greater volunteer involvement in 2021.

While SEHA is very appreciative of its great coaches, managers and selectors that put their hand up each year – a larger core committee would provide greater support to the program. It would also derisk the program from its current concentration of knowledge about the program. It is worth noting that at the end of 2021, I will end my 2nd and final 2-year term as Representative Director (based on the constitution). It is also the case that my daughters will play U18's in 2021, so their time in junior reps is coming to an end.

SEHA has made considerable advances in the way it manages the program – such as the use of the website and SEHA revolutionise system to communicate information to stakeholders and arrange trials. This has made the core tasks we do much more manageable. Many of the templates for the web pages and emails only require minimal changes each year now they are established.

The above-mentioned storage project, and the expansion to a more comprehensive Rep Policy earlier this year are major projects that set the program up for long term success.
