Introduction

SEHA is a Hockey Association formed in 2015 under the Hockey NSW restructure of associations in NSW. SEHA is one of six associations in the Greater Sydney area and covers an area from Glebe in the city/inner west out to Bankstown in the south-west, down towards Engadine in the south and into Daceyville in the east. The association covers 13 hockey clubs and four Synthetic turf fields managed by member clubs: Daceyville, Kyeemagh, Cintra and Bankstown.

SEHA conducts local junior and senior competitions and provides representative level hockey for its members, to State Championship level, in field and indoor hockey, for juniors, opens, and masters, boys, girls, men and women.

1 PRESIDENT'S REPORT

On behalf of the Sydney East Hockey Association (SEHA) Board I am pleased to present the Annual Report 2018, which includes our audited financial statements which show a healthy performance for our fourth year of operation.

Together with the support of an exceptional volunteer base; our Directors, Convenors, Committees, Umpires, Officials, Coaches, Managers and many parent volunteers we are very proud to serve our affiliate Clubs and their 1911 registered playing members comprising:

- o18: 1253
- u18: 658

See Table 1 for the summary results of the SEHA member participation survey facilitated by HNSW for an insight on lost, new and returning players, noting we have 31 % churn rate over the previous year.

The Board's focus has been set out in our SEHA Strategic Plan 2017 to 2020, which sets out our Vision, Mission, Objectives and Strategies and is included in this report at the end.

VISION to Champion the growth of hockey

- we provide growth and pathways via development programs for players, umpires, coaches and officials
- we run competitions
- we provide representative hockey opportunities for our members and take them to State Championships– (outdoor/indoor all age groups junior opens and masters)

SEHA manages three well run competitions on a cost recovery basis for our affiliated clubs and all competitions which experienced growth this year:

- SEHA Women's Competition
- SEHA Junior Competition (boys and girls)
- SEHA Schoolgirls Competition
- (Noting our men's clubs play in the Sydney wide, Sydney Men's Hockey Association run competitions.)

Highlights/challenges experienced this year:

- a huge effort by Tanya to centralize fixtures and improve fixtures utilisation
- improvements to administration of members via the revolutionise database system
- we are very proud of our members that achieved State and National representative success, especially young Miles Davis who made it to the Youth Olympics in Argentina this year (see Representative report for honors and achievements).



- we adopted the new HNSW State Championship Eligibility Policy which is about playing rep hockey where you play club hockey.
- Families benefited from our junior fee reduction and the HNSW – Active Kids Rebate (\$100 school age kids) program
- I personally have endeavoured to get down to the grass roots of our association and via the rep involvements as a coach manager and selector get to know and understand all facets of the association and the issues facing our families. I am always amazed by the very talented and dedicated people I meet along the way.

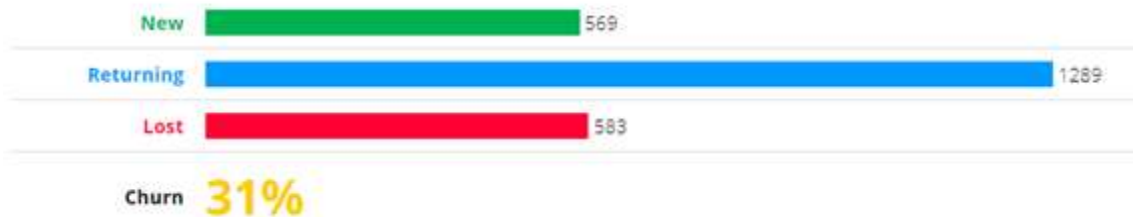

2 GOVERNANCE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

This new position on the board in 2018, has enabled us to commence the foundational work to enhance our governance activities across our competitions. It is important that our members understand that our SEHA associations strives to champion the growth of hockey and foster a safe and inclusive environment that promotes participation and we also align to Hockey NSW mission to operate with integrity, transparency and excellence.

During, 2018 we established a consistent and transparent exemption handling process across all our competitions with their respective committees – Women's and Junior's which was recorded centrally. Overall, the exemptions process worked smoothly, however there were a number of request that were not supported at both the committee and board level, these fell outside our SEHA policies/guidelines. In preparation for next season, I encourage all clubs to work with their teams (mangers, officials, players, members and parents) to set clear expectations around registrations and eligibility.

Ahead of the 2019 season we will also look to increase pre-season communications to outline each competition guidelines, game days, field management, key dates and registration rules to clubs, players and parents. This will also extend into the junior/representative competitions this will also include game formats and exemption requests, and for clubs hosting games at their home fields we need to ensure that our SEHA duty of care to players and spectators are met.

I would also like to thank my fellow board members for their support as I transitioned into this role.

2 FINANCE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

SEHA remains in a strong financial position and able to effectively support all areas of operation. This season saw a further reduction in the Association Admin Fee for junior registrations, in order to help make participation in Hockey more affordable.

I am pleased to note that after much chasing, we were able to get most of our income and expenditure finalised before the end of the financial year, with the exception of some income from the schoolgirls' competition. It is important, in order to accurately report on the season and to check budgets, that invoices are paid on time; and that venues get their bills in, to get paid before the end of our financial year.



Seasonally adjusted, most areas of our operations made (or will make) modest surpluses:

Junior Competition	1.5%
Schoolgirls' Competition	7% * after due income is realised
Women's Competition	<1%
Indoor Reps	8%
Junior Reps	13%
Senior Reps	22%
Masters (comp & reps)	13%
Admin	15%

I would like to thank the competition committees and representative convenors for their diligence in managing these operations within budget. There may be some opportunity for some of these to fine-tune their costings and aim for a surplus of less than 5%.

I have enjoyed the challenge of the Finance Director's role, during the first four years of the Association's operation. I hope that we, the Board, have set in place strategies that will see the Association thrive into the future and be able to support and encourage players of all levels to reach their potential. I challenge everyone to find how they can help the Association fulfil its commitment to our members. Be it as a coach or manager; committee member; convenor; or Board member, everyone can find some time to do something to help the Association in some way.

I have reviewed the online Quickbooks accounting file for Sydney East Hockey Association (SEHA) for the period 1 October 2017 to 30 September 2018.

The accounts are prepared on a cash basis and the Balance Sheet is correct as at 30 September 2018 on this basis. Items recorded in the Profit and Loss Statement for the year 1 October 2017 to 30 September 2018 also appear to be correctly entered and classified based on my review.

There were a few comments which I want to highlight as part of my review:

Asset Register

There were new indoor goals purchased in October 2017. These have been expensed under Equipment in the Profit and Loss since the total cost of each goal was less than \$1,000. I recommend a separate asset register be kept so that the physical location is recorded for equipment.

Overall, the Quickbooks file and invoices were well organised. The attached Balance Sheet and Profit and Loss Statement prepared reflect the financial operations during the year.

Summary

The Competition ran over 18 rounds between April and September with weeks off for Vets and the Long Weekend in June. The main issues we experienced this year were with umpiring issues from UNSW who failed to provide umpires on a regular basis in the higher grades. As we rostered games this year, this meant that other clubs were impacted by UNSW's failures which meant that we had to revert to them umpiring their own premier division matches to ensure they felt some of the inconvenience.

We also had ongoing issues with the Daceyville facilities – despite the hard work and efficiency of the club contact for bookings. Viewing areas remain restricted and facilities on site not sanitary or convenient.

Grand Final Day was held again at Kyeemagh on a Saturday afternoon which whilst convenient for umpires and Premier Division sides is not so for the lower 3 grades who play all games on a Sunday throughout the season.

As the Association has been unable to fill the role of umpire's development, we had a season with little or no development within the ranks on a practical level, although we were able to develop umpires from an experience level on good quality games with an organised roster for the year, managed by Briony Nilan.

In 2019 we will be reviewing our competition rules to ensure we have less issues over exemption requests for finals and better guidelines for umpire attendance to avoid some issues experienced in 2018. We will also be striving to ensure a less bumpy start to the season each year with competition entries. Finally, we will need to continue to address field usage of association-based fields.

My thanks to our committee who were efficient and committed despite wearing many hats and to the club contacts who worked within our framework to deliver an enjoyable competition. Also to the umpires and convenors who came out rain, hail or shine week in and week out.

2018 Competition Entries

The nomination and entry process was ineffective, with clubs entering and withdrawing teams well after the draw was to be completed, resulting in multiple drafts of the draw. Further, clubs were not mindful of skill level of their sides when entering teams, nor where some co-operative with changing grading. Due to this habit, we had for example, a 11s competition with 15 sides, 10 of which were in B division and only five in A division.

Pre-season

A grading and carnival day was held in March to help with grading requirements. A thank you to Moorebank for hosting this day. This was not largely effective as some teams refused to participate, and yet others did not send umpires to officiate their matches.

Fields and Draw

The Competition utilised fields at Sutherland, Bankstown, Daceyville, Moorebank, Glebe, Kyeemagh, Lidcombe and Marang. This presented difficulties with only Bankstown, Kyeemagh and Sutherland being available each week. There were also divisions when it came to the usage of the Glebe grass, with clubs in 11b agreeing to play there but only on limited weekends and then the field itself not being available all the time. Of the 5-6 weeks scheduled, two of these dates were cancelled for wet weather. There was also pressure from Marang to utilise their facilities whilst not being a Sydney East venue. The constraints of home and away matches and Fridays v Saturdays were added into this scenario. The bottom line with these issues is that all clubs have hard and fast requirements, whilst the competition has restrictions and these two situations are not compatible. These issues were exacerbated by the addition of

micro managing requirements for individual teams and players – e.g. clubs wanting particular time slots or venues so a single player can participate in a single way.

7 SEHA REPRESENTATIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Field Teams

- SEHA has entered 10 teams into Junior Hockey NSW Field State Championship in 2017.
- 3 teams in Open State Championships (1 women, 2 men)
- Additionally, we had 2 girls and 1 boy U/11 teams play at the Tamworth carnival.
- Teams played at Canberra, Lithgow and Moorebank carnivals.
- 173 individual players in juniors, with 10 of these players playing across 2 teams.
- 42 players in Opens
- Very committed group of coaches and managers
- Increased player depth in U/11 girls and Open men.
- Decreased player numbers in U/15 girls and Open women
- Maintained player depth in all other age groups
- State Championship results highlights were the U/15 girls finishing 3rd in Division 1 and the U/13 boys bouncing back from relegation last year to win promotion to Division 1 by finishing 2nd in Division 2.
- U/18 Boys 1 team winning the "Play the Whistle" Award in 2018.



Financial

- 4 outstanding fee payment in junior reps (97.5% paid)
- 1 outstanding payments across Opens (98% paid)
- 7 players granted special consideration
- Overall rep program is fully funded by player payments.

Administration

- Hockey NSW Revolutionise system continued to work well for state championships team selection and management.
- Adoption by team managers to using the system to manage their own teams was not as successful as first hoped. Time did not allow the creation of the manual, and even if this had been in place many managers were simply not comfortable from a technology point of view using it.
- Low volunteer numbers across the junior rep committee a challenge, second year with no committee as such – but the team managers were supportive as always. Fellow Directors and Briony Nilan continue to provide a valuable sounding board.
- Started to see some new coaches coming into the program, which was a positive improvement.

- Umpires were managed fairly well this year, though did need to use a local umpire for one championship.
- New representative selection policy for 2018 was extremely and strictly enforced in 2018 by Hockey NSW. This provided certainty but did make for some difficulties when emotional situation arose. This approach also benefited those people who understood the system from the start and could tailor their registration to meet their representative objectives.

Indoor

- Indoor season for 2018 concludes prior to Christmas, including Masters which have been moved from early in the new year.
- SEHA entered 5 junior teams in U/13, U/15 and U/18. U/15 boys the only age group with no team. Numbers in U/13 boys were higher than previously, but not enough for 2 teams, so we had to release some players.
- SEHA entered 1 men's opens team and one women's 1 master's team. Not enough for an open women's team this year unfortunately.
- Thank you to Briony Nilan who once again managed the Indoor Rep Committee with great efficiency.
- Coaches and Managers were very committed and did a great job

2018 equipment

- Purchased 100 field balls to replace older and lost balls, a new ball cage, cones and bibs.
- Utilised the new team bags which cost about \$330 for the first time, which were well received.
- Purchased the same bags for our indoor kits in time for the 2018 indoor season (cost around \$200).
- Purchased a new set of shirts for U/13 boys and Women's Masters (cost about \$600 per team (new teams)).
- Replaced lost shirts across all teams to the value of about \$600
- Purchased more indoor singlets, due to growth in indoor popularity (around \$1300)
- Introduced a voucher system for coaches and managers to purchase team clothing - \$50 for managers, \$100 for coaches. This was very positively received. The aim was to have the coaches and managers easily recognisable to assist with child protection and interactions with officials, other teams and spectators. Total cost for indoor and field teams was about \$1200 in 2018. Was a successful program in terms of adoption.

2019 Preparations

- Recovery and stocktake of all equipment and playing shirts very close to completion.
- Purchase of ball, ball cages and cones to replace older equipment.

- Trial dates will be split in 2019. U/18 will occur in early February and U/15, U/13 and U/11 in early March. Benefits of this are:
 - ❖ More time for U/18 to prepare for their championships in early May
 - ❖ Less concern with U/18's missing trials due to it being early season.
 - ❖ Younger age groups are focused on Centre of Development till the Regional Challenge in mid-Feb, but U/18 are not.
- Trying to make greater use of the Revolutionise system for communications and event management in representative space.
